The only information we have about Mary<sup>9</sup> is that she had two children with John Bayly<sup>9</sup>; one was born on 20 Jan 1680/1 and the other on 10 Jan 1683/4 [ref# 801; p. 2]. If Mary<sup>9</sup> had her first child at the age of 17 then must have been born before 1664. She was still living in Jan 1684. And John Bayly<sup>9</sup> and Mary<sup>9</sup> must have married before 1681.
